Merry Christmas and Happy New Year,

We have very few big things (except the fire) to report this year, yay! It turns out that the little things are taking up all our time now since it seems that life is getting evermore complicated.

I have been up on "the land" almost every day trying to keep up with routine maintenance and also trying to automate as many chores as possible. The Cerro Pelado forest fire this spring during which we were evacuated for about a month and which burned a lot of the vegetation in our area gave the "pricker bushes" an excuse to grow like mad as soon as the rain came. That meant a lot of work clearing the defensible space again. The wet summer we had seems to be the case after a forest fire. (I wonder if the people who try to make rain by emitting air born particles have a point?)

The fire fighters used our land to find spot fires for about a month after the main fire was "out" because of the good view from it. It was interesting to look down upon the helicopters they called out to drop water on smokes. I was also able give them about 1200 gallons of water to refill their trucks as they were emptied when they were used to put out smokes. (A rather boring job since most of the time they just sat in their trucks looking for fires.) They managed to prevent any damage to our structures-hurray!
